The Broad Announces New Talks, Live Music, and Educational Programming for Special Exhibition *Keith Haring: Art Is for Everybody* Opening May 27, 2023

Exhibition Will Make North American Tour to Art Gallery of Ontario and Walker Art Center Following Debut at The Broad



LOS ANGELES, CA (February 23, 2023) – The Broad is pleased to announce advance details for the upcoming special exhibition *Keith Haring: Art Is for Everybody*, running from May 27 to October 8, 2023. As the first ever museum in Los Angeles to present Haring's expansive body of work, The Broad's *Keith Haring: Art Is for Everybody* will feature over 120 artworks and archival materials. A range of programming timed to the show will include talks, community based projects with Los Angeles' youth, musical performances, and events organized by members of Haring's own personal circle from the 1980's club circuit. Tickets to the exhibition will be available for presale at <a href="thebroad.org">thebroad.org</a> beginning on Tuesday, April 11, and will be available to the general public on Friday, April 14.



Following its debut in Los Angeles, The Broad is delighted to announce *Keith Haring: Art Is for Everybody* will travel to the <u>Art Gallery of Ontario</u>, in Toronto, from November 11, 2023 to March 17, 2024, and then to the <u>Walker Art Center</u>, in Minneapolis, from April 27 to September 8, 2024.

Highlights of newly announced public programming will unite musicians, writers, and activists through the many influences behind Haring's work, such as art accessibility, AIDS activism and human rights advocacy, and the importance of community.

On **June 1, 2023**, following the opening of the exhibition, The Broad will host an Un-Private Collection conversation at the Ace Theater downtown between choreographer and Haring collaborator, **Bill T. Jones** and Haring biography author **Brad Gooch**. The Un-Private Collection is an ongoing series of public programs The Broad began in September 2013. The series introduces audiences to the museum's 2,000-work contemporary art collection by showcasing stories behind the collection through conversations among artists and cultural luminaries.

The Broad series *Summer Happenings 2023* will consist of two events in conjunction with *Keith Haring: Art Is for Everybody*, each of which will include after-hours access to the exhibition as well as cash bars.

# **Summer Happenings: Club 57**

The Broad teams up with iconic denizen of the 1980s East Village art scene Ann Magnuson to revisit and reignite the spirit and energy of the infamous neo-Dada cabaret Club 57, which she managed and where she met and befriended Keith Haring. Expect performances and DJ sets by legendary artists who were part of the original Club 57 and who knew Haring personally, as well as subsequent generations of artists who pay homage to or embody new examples of the grit, glitter, and experimentation that proliferated at Club 57.

## **Summer Happenings: 50th Anniversary of Hip-Hop**

Celebrate the 50th anniversary of hip-hop with a blowout concert on the East West Bank Plaza at The Broad. Hip-hop was proliferating at the time that Keith Haring was living and working in the East Village of New York. Haring embraced the music genre and participated in the lifestyle by creating graffiti and public murals as well as incorporating boom boxes, break dancers, and other urban imagery and social commentary into his paintings. He was also friends with many music producers, DJs, and musicians, notably Fab 5 Freddy.
